Race Rules

1 - ORGANISATION

The Association **MAJUSCHULE** (Association law 1901 registered on 01/14/2008 at the Prefecture of Haute Garonne under the number W313008309), hereinafter referred to as the Organiser, is organizing 'Le Grand Raid des Pyrénées' on **August the 24th, 25th, 26th and 27th, 2023.**

2 - REGISTRATION CONDITIONS

These races are open to anyone, male or female, born before December 31st, 2003 (Junior, Senior, M0, M1, M2, M3, M4, M5, M6, M7, M8categories) either licensed or not.

It is important that the participants who register are aware of the difficulties of the course and the conditions they can find (length of the route, height difference, bad weather conditions, part of the night race, etc.). This requires on their part a good physical preparation and a capacity of autonomy to ensure their success in this type of individual adventure.

3 ACCEPTANCE OF THE RULES AND ETHICS OF THE RACE

Participation in the GRP events implies express and unreserved acceptance of these rules, the ethics of the event and any instructions sent by the organizer to participants.

Registration for a race is firm and final. This commitment is personal, no transfer of registration is authorized for any reason whatsoever.

No exchange of bibs with a runner registered for another race is possible.

The transfer of a bib with an unregistered runner is prohibited.

Any person transferring or exchanging a bib to a third party will be held responsible in the event of an accident.

Anyone with a bib acquired in violation of the rules will be disqualified.

The bib must be fully legible during the race on the front side of the runner.

The organization declines all responsibility in the event of a violation of the rules.

No animal can accompany the runners.

The race is individual, including during the relays of the Ultra 160 relay race, at free pace, in a limited time. Anyone without a bib is not allowed to accompany a runner on the race route.

4 - EVENTS

The **Grand Raid des Pyrénées** consists of 7 races :

- Ultra Tour Solo: 160 km - D+ 10000 m
- Ultra Tour relay race of 4 runners: 160 km - D+ 10000 m
- Tour des Cirques: 120 km - D+ 8000 m
- Tour des Lacs: 80 km - D+ 5000 m
- Tour du Moudang: 60 km - D+ 3800 m
- Tour de la Gela: 40 km - D+ 3400 m
- Tour du Néouvielle: 40 km - D+ 2400 m

The distances are given as an indication, certain routes, for questions of security or availability, may be modified resulting in variations, either a decrease or an increase of the race distances.

5 - CONDITIONS FOR THE RUNNING OF THE RACES

Routes

Most of the routes follow paths that runners must stay on at all times to respect the flora and fauna. Portions take traffic lanes on which the highway code must be strictly observed.

The routes are prepared many months before the edition. Occasional changes may be made following work or damage related to meteorological phenomena. In this case a modified itinerary will be proposed. As a result, the distances communicated may be slightly modified.

Self-sufficiency

The races take place on the principle of self-sufficiency and oblige the participants to be autonomous.

Aid stations (liquids and / or solids) are distributed over all the routes. These aid stations will be indicated in the road book which will be provided by the Organisation and put online on our website:

Life Base (a hot dish is offered additionally to the standard supply)

For the **Ultra Tour160** km 2 Life Bases at Pierrefitte and Luz Saint Sauveur.

For the **Tour des Cirques** 120 km 1 Life Base at Luz Saint Sauveur.

These Life Bases allow participants to rest.

At the aid stations, personal assistance (apart from medical or paramedical care) is allowed. This assistance (limited to only one person) must be provided within a perimeter of less than 50 meters (tune assistance zone) around the aid station. A hot shower is possible on arrival at Vielle-Aure. It is also possible to take a cold shower at Pierrefitte.

The Ultra Tour 160 km relay:

This race uses the Ultra Tour 160 km route, same place, same start time and same cut-off times.

Three runners' relay areas are located at La Mongie, Pierrefitte and Luz Saint-Sauveur.

The teams are made up of 4 runners, men, women or mixed-gender.

If a relay is not completed, in case of forfeit of a runner, the team cannot continue the race and will be declared as having forfeited the race.

Each team member must have a valid medical certificate for the team to be accepted.

6 - SIGNAGE

The signposts for the various races are put in place in the days preceding the event. They allow participants to follow the planned route without the need for maps or descriptions.

This signage is the only official one, regardless of the GPX traces previously given on the organization's website.

The signposts will be removed by race closing volunteers who will leave each of the checkpoints at the scheduled time cut-off.

Caution: As a result, it is recommended that participants who want to rest, sleep by the side of the path, as the race closing volunteers may not see the participants asleep during the signage removal.

7 – REGISTRATION RULES

Submission of the request:

Registrations are made only through the race website:

Race Rules

The opening dates for registrations for each race are communicated through the organisation's website and social networks.

Individual registrations by post, email or telephone will not be accepted.

Consideration of the request:

Registrations are taken into account after payment.

Registrations are confirmed by an email and proof of payment.

Failure to receive at least one of these two emails must be reported as soon as possible to the following address:

Reference races:

Registration for the Ultra Trails (Ultra 160, Tour des Cirques and Tour des Lacs) is subject to the prior completion, within five years before registration, of a reference race as a "finisher" which characteristics are as follows: :

- The Ultra 160 (except the relay): a race of at least 80 km and 5,000 m of elevation gain.
- Le Tour des Cirques: a race of at least 60 km and 3,000 m of elevation gain.
- The Tour des Lacs: a race of at least 40 km and 2,000 m of elevation gain.

A sworn statement will be requested through the registration platform.

Random checks will be carried out by the organization.

In case of a false declaration, registration will be cancelled without compensation.

Closing of registrations:

Registrations are closed race by race as soon as the maximum capacity of runners is reached and no later than June 30, 2023, at midnight.

Consultation of the status of the file:

Runners are able at any time to consult the status of their files on the home page and the "registrations" section of the website:

8 - MEDICAL CERTIFICATE

Registration cannot be confirmed without the production of a valid medical certificate or sports license.

Each runner must upload it on his or her registration file, no other means of communication (email, post, etc.) may be used.

The deadline for submission on the registration site is fixed at:

July 16, 2023, at midnight.

On this date, incomplete files will be cancelled without the possibility of a complaint.

One or more reminder messages may be sent by the organization to runners who have not uploaded their medical certificate.

If a valid medical certificate or approved sports license is not provided, registration will be cancelled without a refund.

Conditions and validity of the medical certificate:

1/ It must be written in French.

Foreign runners must use the model medical certificate provided in four languages (French, English, Spanish, Italian), online on the organization's website:

2/ It must be dated within a year of the day of the start of the race for which the runner is registered.

3/ It must include the complete and legible contact details of the doctor.

The Shared Directory of Healthcare Professionals (RPPS) number is mandatory.

For self-employed doctors, the RPPS number in addition to the health insurance number must be indicated.

For substitute physicians who do not yet have this number, the RPPS number must be that of the incumbent physician.

For physicians employed by an establishment, the RPPS number in addition to the number of the establishment must be included.

For military doctors, the RPPS number in addition to the structure number must be indicated.

4/ It must include the obligatory mention “authorization or absence of contraindication to the practice of running in competition” or “authorization or absence of contraindication to the practice of any sport in competition”.

The validation of the medical certificate is an essential condition to confirm registration.

9 - NUMBER OF BIBS PER RACE

The maximum capacity for races in the 2023 edition is as follows:

- The Ultra Tour: 600 runners.
- The Ultra Tour in relay by team of 4 runners: 50 teams.
- The Tour des Cirques: 800 runners.
- The Tour des Lacs: 1,600 runners.
- The Tour du Moudang: 800 runners.
- The Tour du Néouvielle: 1,600 runners.
- The Tour de la Gela: 800 runners.

11 - CANCELLATION OF AN ENTRY

For participants who so wish, “cancellation” insurance is offered at the time of registration.

This option can be subscribed with the company proposed by the organization, the link to subscribe will be on the registration platform.

The cancellation insurance offered at registration is not mandatory, if they wish, runners can take out another insurance.

This insurance allows the participant, under certain conditions established by the chosen insurer, to be reimbursed for the registration fees paid.

The terms of reimbursement are indicated in the insurer's contract.

Without cancellation insurance, the runner cannot claim any reimbursement of registration fees.

12 - THE CHANGE OF RACE

A change of race is possible depending on the places available on the requested race and this, until June 30, 2023, at midnight.

Requests must be made by email to: contact@grandraidpyrenees.com.

The change requested for a race for which the registration fee is higher will only be taken into account after payment of the additional registration amount.

Otherwise, for a race for which the registration fee is lower, no refund may be required.

13 - EQUIPEMENT

Mandatory gear for participants:

Ultra Tour, Tour des Cirques, Tour des Lacs and Tour du Moudang

- Personal cup for drinking liquids (water, coke and soup) at the aid stations
- Minimum water reserve 1.5 litres
- Food reserves
- Two torches in good working order with spare batteries for both of them
- Survival blanket (minimum 2 m²)
- Whistle
- Adhesive elastic band for bandaging or strapping
- Waterproof and breathable jacket with hood, membrane type or coating (at least 10000 schmerber) (KWAY type jackets or poncho not accepted)
- Long pants or running tights or three-quarter length shorts with rising socks (This solution is accepted only if the legs can be fully covered)
- Cap or equivalent
- Closed shoes with rigid uppers. Sandals, crocs, bare feet are strictly prohibited
- Long sleeve warm clothing, serving as a second layer between the t-shirt and the waterproof jacket (e.g. fleece or other warm technical clothing) (*)
- gloves completely covering the hands (muffles accepted) (*)

(*): The Organiser may decide before the start of the race to make this equipment recommended and no longer mandatory (typically based on weather forecast). This announcement will be made at the time of the race briefing.

Tour du Néouvielle and Tour de la Gela

- Personal cup for drinking liquids (water, coke and soup) at the aid stations
- Minimum water reserve 1 litre
- Food reserves
- Survival blanket (minimum 2 m²)
- Whistle
- Waterproof and breathable jacket with hood, membrane type or coating (at least 10000 schmerber) (KWAY type jackets or poncho **not accepted**)
- Closed shoes with rigid uppers. Sandals, crocs, bare feet are strictly prohibited.

Recommended gear (Non-exhaustive list)

- Mobile phone
- gloves, hat, warm clothing essential in bad weather conditions.
- telescopic walking poles
- change of clothes
- sun cream, Vaseline or anti-rub cream

During the race, for safety reasons, according to the decision of the Organisation, control should be performed. Any participant called for a control is required to submit to it. In case of refusal, the participant will be disqualified.

Some participants may, depending on the decision of the Organisation, be equipped with a GPS tracking beacon (weight: approximately 200g). The participant must keep the tag on him until his arrival and return it to the Organisation. In case of abandonment, the participant will return it to the controller at the checkpoint, or bring back it to the Organisation at the race control centre.

14 – RACE BIB

No bib will be given on the morning of the day of the start of the race.

When retrieving the bibs, the presentation of a photo ID is required.

A random check of the compulsory equipment will be carried out before the delivery of the bib.

The runner's commitment:

Each runner signs a sworn statement to keep the equipment described above with them throughout the race.

This commitment includes a commitment to respect the instructions for the preservation of nature and more particularly the area of the Pyrenees National Park.

Unannounced checks of the compulsory equipment will be carried out on the races. In the event of a lack, penalties (disqualification) will be applied, for lack of respect for the safety instructions (see paragraph below).

In order to allow control and more particularly the recording of passages at checkpoints, the bib is placed on the chest, stomach or leg, but imperatively on the front side of the runner. It must be permanently and fully visible throughout the race.

The wearing of the bib on the bag or the backside of the runner is not authorized.

A chip is glued to the back of the bib for detection during timing checks.

A second chip is provided to attach to the backpack.

Concerning the Ultra 160R a unique relay chip will be given to the team with the bibs. It must be passed on to the next runner at each relay area.

Case of bib withdrawals by proxy:

Any bib collection by a third party must be the subject of a power of attorney written on paper (model available on the site under the runner space) with a copy of the identity documents of both the runner and the designated person.

In this case, the runner must, at the start, present a copy of his identity document in order to be able to access the start area. The control of the bag can be carried out at the same time.

15 – LIFE BASE BAGS

When collecting the race bib, some life base bags (2 for Ultra Tour 160 and 1 for Tour des Cirques) with a capacity of 30 litres each are given as well as the necessary labels with his race bib number allowing him to identify each bag. After preparing their belongings, the participant must deposit his fully closed bag(s) between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. at the Vielle-Aure reception centre. Putting walking sticks in a bag is strictly prohibited.

The bags given to the participants (and containing the participant's spare personal belongings) are taken from Vielle-Aure, on the respective life bases of each race.

When a participant arrives at a life base, he must imperatively collect his bag. When he leaves this base, he must deposit it in the place provided by the Organisation. When the last life base is closed, the participants' bags are returned to Vielle-Aure. They are returned on presentation of the race bib, at the place of arrival of the race on Saturday from 8 p.m. to 12 p.m. and on Sunday from 6 a.m. to 11 a.m.

As no verification of the bags will be made before departure, it is not possible to challenge the contents of the bags recovered. The Organiser disclaims all responsibility in the event of loss. It is recommended that participants do not leave any valuables in these bags.

16 - CHECK POINTS AND AID STATIONS

Check points and aid stations are distributed along the route. Only participants with a visible race bib will have access to the aid stations. Accompanying person is allowed to access the aid stations of the 2 life bases only (only 1 accompanying person per participant so as not to clutter up the base stations). **Accompanying persons are not allowed to enter in the aid stations as well as to run along the course with the participants.**

17 - SAFETY AND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

Runners must provide assistance to any participant in difficulty.

Rescue is coordinated by the race PC or locally by stations located on the routes.

The aid stations are intended to provide assistance to any person in danger with the means available to the Organisation or supporting teams.

The official doctors are empowered to disqualify (by invalidating the race bib) any participant unfit to continue the event. Doctors and nurses are empowered to have participants whom they deem in danger evacuated by any means at their convenience.

If necessary, for reasons always in the interest of the person being rescued, official Mountain Rescue will be called upon, who will then take charge of operations and implement all appropriate means, including included helicopter evacuation.

A participant calling on a doctor or a nurse submits to their authority and undertakes to accept their decisions.

18 - MAXIMUM AUTHORISED TIME AND TIME LIMITS

The maximum time for the event, for the entire course, is set at:

- Ultra Tour 160 km Solo: 49 hours
- Ultra Tour 160 km Relay: 43 hours

- Tour des Cirques 120 km: 41 hours
- Tour des Lacs 80 km: 25 hours
- Tour du Moudang 60 km: 18 hours
- Tour de la Gela 40 km: 12 hours 30 minutes
- Tour du Néouvielle 40 km: 12 hours

The latest departure times (time barriers) of the checkpoints will be defined and communicated in the road book. A link will be placed on the home page of our website.

These time barriers are calculated to allow participants to reach the finish in the maximum time allowed, while making possible stops (rest, meals ...). To be authorised to continue the event, the participants must leave the checkpoint before the time limit set. For some checkpoints, a time barrier is also set up at the entrance to the checkpoint (see roadbook).

Any rider who is taken out of the race will have his bib cancelled (chips removal) and will not be allowed to continue his race. If despite everything, the person decides to continue hiking, he does it under his own responsibility.

19 - DROPOUT

In case of dropout, the participant must obligatorily notify the person in charge of the nearest checkpoint and return his race bib there. The person responsible for the checkpoint permanently cancelled the race bib by recovering both chips.

Participants who abandon at a checkpoint or aid station and whose state of health does not require an emergency evacuation must by their own means go to a repatriation point as soon as possible and at the latest before the departure of the last repatriation.

In case of non-compliance with this obligation, the participant relinquishes their responsibility towards the Organiser.

20 - PENALTIES - DISQUALIFICATION

By registering for one of the races, the runners agree to:

- Respect the environment
- Follow the course without cutting the trails
- Do not use transportation
- Do not throw rubbish on the course
- Register at all checkpoints
- Wear the race bib on their front and visible during the entire event
- Carry the compulsory equipment with them during the whole event
- Assist any participant in difficulty
- Be examined by a doctor and respect their decision
- Submit to anti-doping control.
- Be respectful to everyone on the course

In the event of non-compliance with one of these commitments, the following sanctions are applied, depending on their seriousness: :

Failure to respect the marked route, cut turns, outside and within the perimeter of the National Park	Disqualification
Non-assistance to a runner in difficulty	Disqualification
Refusal to obey an order from a chief of post, a doctor, the race director	Disqualification
Use of a means of transport or failure to check in	Disqualification
Bib exchange	Disqualification
Refusal to submit to doping control	Disqualification

21 - ANTI-DOPING CONTROL

Any participant may be subjected to a doping control before, during or at the finish of the event. In the event of refusal or abstention, the participant will be sanctioned in the same way as if he were convinced of doping.

22 - CANCELLATION OF THE EVENT BEFORE AND DURING THE EDITION

Before the start of the races:

In case of force majeure (exceptionally bad weather, administrative ban, or any unforeseeable event), the amount of registrations will remain with the organization. Cancellation insurance costs will not be refunded.

During the race:

In the case of "force majeure", the organizer can stop the race. In this case, the runner arriving at a refueling or control point must follow the instructions given by the volunteers and will be obliged to respect them. No refunds will be made.

23 - RACE JURY AND APPEALS

The race jury is composed by:

- The Organising Committee
- The medical team presents on the race
- The persons in charge of the relevant check points

Claims are accepted in writing within 30 minutes of the posting of the provisional rankings and during fifteen days after end of the races.

24 - MODIFICATIONS OF THE ROUTE OR TIME LIMITS

For safety reasons, in particular in the event of extreme weather conditions, the Organiser reserves the right to delay the start of the races by up to 4 hours, to stop the races or to modify the routes and the time barriers, even to cancel the races without notice, without the participants being able to claim any compensation or reimbursement of the registration fees.

25 - LIABILITY INSURANCE

In accordance with current legislation, the Organiser has taken out insurance covering the financial consequences of its civil liability, that of its volunteers and that of all participants in the event. About the civil liability of the participants themselves, the above-mentioned insurance policy will only cover accidents caused to third parties by the participants during the event.

Licensed participants benefit from the guarantees granted by the insurance linked to their license and it is the responsibility of other participants to take out personal insurance.

The gear is not insured, in case of breakage or loss, the organization cannot be held responsible.

Consequently, participants are strongly advised to take out individual accident insurance covering their own risks.

In case of dropout or disqualification the responsibility of the Organisation is released.

26 - RESPECT FOR THE ENVIRONMENT

By registering for one of the Grand Raid des Pyrenees course, participants agree to respect the environment and the natural areas that they will cross.

In particular:

- The runners must not deviate from the path marked by the organisation,
- They should not cut the zigzags,
- They must respect the environment crossed
- They should not throw their rubbish on the ground,
- They must transport their rubbish to the next aid station located in a building
- They should not make noise that could disturb wildlife
- No disposable and non-biodegradable plates and cutlery will be supplied at the aid stations. Eco-cups will therefore be compulsory for cold or hot liquids.

27 - RESULTS AND PRIZES

For the races, only the runners crossing the finish line are ranked and for each race a general male and female ranking is established.

The age categories will give rise to a separate classification in the different events (Junior, Senior, M0, M1, M2, M3, M4, M5, M6, M7 and M8).

The first three of each race, male and female, will be rewarded.

The first of each age category, male and female, will be rewarded.

For the Ultra 160 relay, the first men's team, the first women's team and the first mixed-gender team will be rewarded.

28 - IMAGE RIGHTS

All participants expressly renounce their image rights during the event, as they renounce any recourse against the Organiser and its approved partners for the use made of their image.

They authorise the Organiser to take, reproduce and communicate to the public photographs taken within the framework of the edition of the Grand Raid des Pyrénées. The photographs and films may be exploited and used directly by the Association MAJUSCHULE and by its approved partners, in any form and any medium known and unknown to date, worldwide, without limitation of duration, in full or in extracts.

The Association expressly refrains from a use of the photographs likely to infringe private life or reputation, or any other harmful exploitation.

29 - PROTECTION OF PERSONAL DATA

According to the Data Protection Act of August 6, 1978 (French law), and in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), any competitor has the right to access and to correct data concerning them.

The information is collected as part of the registration process for one of the Grand Raid des Pyrénées races for the purposes of identifying each competitor. This information is used to allocate clothing, to ensure the physical capacity of the competitor and to participate in the race.

They are used to communicate, before, during and after the event, all information related to participation as well as to transmit information from certain partners.

For this last point, the runner will have at the time of registration the possibility of accepting or refusing.

The data is kept for 10 years from the year of registration.

This limit is set by the legal retention period for the medical certificate.

Beyond these 10 years and unless explicitly authorized by the runner, all data is deleted except civil status data which allows the classifications to be kept.

Runners can request the anonymization of their file from the registration platform. This operation will be carried out for those who request it, 60 days after the end of the event.
